Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report of meeting held 7 April 2025

<u>Chair/Vice Chair</u> – Cllr Darrell Howard was re-elected Chair of the Council and Cllr Nigel Ligard re-elected Vice Chair. Members thanked them for continuing in these roles and for their work on behalf of the Council and community.

<u>Community Litter Pick 26 April 2025</u> – many thanks were recorded to all those who took part in the community litter pick, a very good effort by all involved. A number of waste bags had been filled and these had been collected promptly by MSDC.

<u>Warm Homes Suffolk</u> – Suffolk CC is promoting a no early repayment charge and up to a 7 year repayment term loan scheme (borrow up to £15,000) to support householders live in a warmer and more sustainable home. Working with social enterprise lender, Lendology CIC, the scheme is open to homeowners to spread the cost of a wide range of energy efficient and renewable measures – solar panels, battery storage, heat pumps and insulation. Details available via the Suffolk CC website, search Warm Homes Suffolk.

<u>Telegraph Pole Solar Receptors</u> – Parishioners have probably noticed the three new telegraph poles with solar receptors that have appeared in the village. It was understood the main purpose was to monitor water usage through water meters and transmit the data to central providers. This data collection helps with efficient water resource management and can also assist in identifying potential leaks or drainage issues.

<u>White Elm Solar Farm</u> – Notification has been received of a non-statutory public consultation for a new Solar PV generation station together with Battery Energy Storage System (BESS), access, landscaping and other associated development on land north of Mendlesham, Suffolk. This takes place between 9 May – 30 June 2025. To view go to following link :

<u>Summer Solstice event 22 June 2025</u> – the parish council agreed a contribution of £250 toward the event which is being organised by the Village Hall

<u>6,000 Public EV Chargepoints Planned</u> Suffolk CC will be installing around 6,000 public electric vehicle (EV) chargepoints across the county on residential streets following a survey undertaken last year. These will be bollard-style units at the kerbside, suitable for long-stay or overnight charging. The project has been made possible due to a successful £5.3 million bid by SCC to the government's Local Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (LEVI) fund.

On Saturday 2nd August from 9-11am we will be collaborating with the Debenham Green Team on their stall outside the Lion pub to promote Repair and Reuse, giving advice on repairs of all sorts and



maybe undertaking repairs if feasible. This may be a more regular thing in the future. There are many Repair Cafés in UK, including Stowmarket and Hollesley. There are no plans to set up a Repair Café in Debenham, but do come along on 2nd August (with your item for repair if you can, or photos if you can't) and we'll chat about the possibilities.

We also partner with a Mobile Shed, which takes equipment and projects to care homes and village halls in Suffolk.

We now have a small shed for painting and spray painting, away from the dust in other areas. We hope soon to have a separate area for welding and other hot work, e.g. angle grinding, which will require some additional funding, and a concrete pad outside for some repairs on cars and motorbikes

The **Reading Quest** returns for this summer with some changes following feedback from last year. We are grateful to our volunteers who help with this. If you can help



with registering children and their progress through the scheme, please speak to our library staff.

Two events are planned for families and children later in the year, both free:

- **Saturday 30 August**: a talk on marine biology for children, by local resident Andrew Donnelly. Adults may enjoy it too!
- Saturday 13 September: a storytelling event with Gerry Donlan (Bards Aloud). Tea and cakes will be available, and certificates for the Reading Quest will be given out to children.

The **Dungeons and Dragons** adult group continue to meet monthly (Saturday evenings) to enjoy an evening of role play story telling. While this is an activity that can and is played online, the group was set up because folk wanted to play in person rather than virtually. The junior group is currently looking for a new Dungeon Master.

Sip and Stitch social group meets on Thursday evenings 7-9pm, every two weeks. It was borne out of the Festive Yarn Bombing group where a need for an evening session was highlighted for those who work. The social aspect is the most important part of the evening, with the stitching being secondary. The evening is provided free of charge as not everyone is able to afford even a minimum fee to attend such events. In addition to the conversation there is often cake! It is an opportunity to share ideas and try something new if one wishes to, and share progress on a project (or receive encouragement to finish one). It has also recently become an informal "book club" as being in a library the conversation often turns to books with author recommendations being shared and books discussed. Everyone is welcome.

Dovebrook Carriage Shed Appeal The Middy's unique Victorian 4-wheeled carriages need protection

Since 2002 the Middy has been operating historic steam trains with genuine Victorian rolling stock to give our visitors, as closely as possible, the experience of train travel in a bygone age.

Our coaching stock consists of Great Eastern Railway no.140, a first class smoking coach built at Stratford Works in 1863. At over 160 years old it is the oldest known Great Eastern Railway carriage in operational service.

Carriage no.12 is a 'brake/third coach built for the Great Eastern in 1875 for £275! It is a sister of a vehicle bought from the Great Eastern by the Middy in 1904, so very close to what was running in the early days of the MSLR. Coach no.13 is also a Great Eastern vehicle which started life in 1876 with 5 third class compartments. At the Middy it has been converted to a first class saloon with three third class compartments to mirror the vehicle that the line's superintendent had made for himself in the early part of the last century.

The Middy needs £100k to install a new siding and carriage storage shed, to stable these historic carriages along with other rolling stock needing protection now and in the future.

Please help us protect these examples of railway history for future generations.

The MSLR, operated entirely by volunteers since 1990, is a registered charity. It has a loyal fan base and an ever-increasing foot-fall of visitors attending the various events laid on each year. The MSLR was Suffolk Museum of the Year in 2015 and has won two first class awards from the Heritage Railway Association.



June 2025 Newsletter



When I was driving recently, my attention turned to the on-coming cars, as I momentarily glanced at the passengers in the front seats. As they passed, I noticed that some of the passengers were sleeping. I certainly have a cat nap when someone else is driving. I guess to do so is to subconsciously have complete trust and faith, believing we are in safe hands, and that we will arrive at our correct destination.

I was turning thoughts about faith whilst sitting in church on Easter morning, as a friend of mine told me about his recent trip to Canada for his daughter's wedding, a wedding which took place on the ice of a frozen lake near Banff. I would never condone walking on a frozen lake or river, but to do so would require complete faith that ice would support me, and an unquestionable trust in those that gave that assurance. My friend told me that as they stood in the middle of the lake, they were informed that someone had in fact fallen through the ice only a matter of days before. I guess trust in humankind sometimes requires an act of blind faith, you make your choice and accept the outcome and decide whether to trust in the advice which you are given.

With Easter only a matter of 6 weeks behind us, the most poignant part of the Easter story that remains for me is the part about 'Doubting Thomas'. Whilst many of Jesus's disciples who heard of the resurrection needed no persuasion that Jesus had risen from the dead, Thomas needed proof, he wanted to initially put his faith in only what he could see and touch. I suspect there may have been arguments amongst them about who was right and who was wrong, I guess an early form of PCC, where disagreements can occur, but over much smaller and seemingly irrelevant things. At that same service on Easter morning, I was talking to a fellow Church-Elder who re-told me his journey of how a single prayer took him from being an atheist to a Christian in a matter of moments. He describes the moment he decided to say the Lord's prayer. His faith that day in something that he did not believe in, resulted in something that, to this day, is even harder to describe.

Modern day life is becoming ever more complex, the world that we may have become comfortable with can change in a moment's notice. Every now and then someone will come along and revolutionise it or make it ten times worse? We have decisions to make, who to trust and who (or what) to believe in. What is truth and what is fake, especially now we have to contend with CGI, AI and fake news. Are we metaphorical passengers in a car with our eyes shut, trusting that all will work out fine in the end or are we perhaps heading to an unknown destination? Do we have a blind faith that the metaphorical ice on which we all stand will continue to sustain us by placing an unwavering trust in humankind to always tell us the right things? There is a line in a song that I have always struggled with, that is until this last Easter Sunday, the line says, *"just prayed to a God I don't believe in"*. If that is true for any of us, be warned that doing so may give you the answer that you may not expect but something which will make an indescribable and life changing difference.
