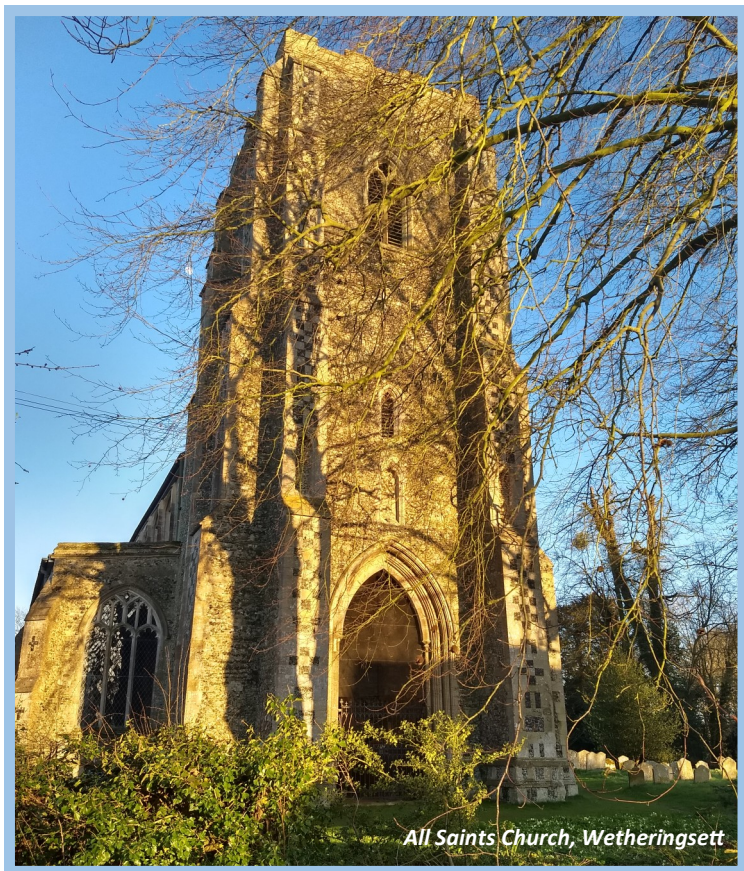

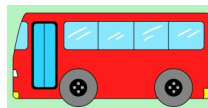

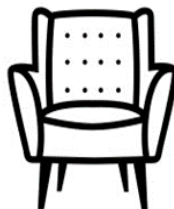

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This term's value: Justice

It's been another busy term at Wetheringsett. Here are just a few things that the children have been doing:

Forest School

To tie in with Chestnut Class's History learning on the Vikings, KS2 have been making bows and arrows, spears and a Viking Longship in Forest School. They also looked at pictures of Viking coins and used an aluminium sheet to make markings and cut out their own version of Viking coins.



KS2 Orienteering Trip:

The children in Key Stage Two had a brilliant time using their map work skills to complete several different orienteering activities. They worked in pairs and small groups to navigate their way around the field at



Hartismere High School following a map and getting to as many control points as possible. The children behaved impeccably despite the chilly weather conditions.

Lime Class Norfolk and Suffolk Aviation Museum trip:



On Tuesday, Lime Class went to the Norfolk and Suffolk Aviation Museum to link with their History learning. During the trip the children learnt all about the Wright Brothers, the names of different parts of the aeroplane



and got to experience walking onto aeroplanes to see how they work. They all had an amazing time and their behaviour was described as impeccable by the museum volunteers.



Chestnut Class Drama Workshop:

On Tuesday Chestnut Class had the first of 2 drama workshops through the Tiny Play, Big Ideas scheme which is run by the Theatre Royal in Bury St Edmunds. The children worked with a professional playwright to learn all about the bare bones of playwriting and discussed how to get their play off the ground. By the end of the 2nd workshop the children will all have written a short 4 minute play in groups. A winning play from each school taking part in the scheme will be performed on stage by professional actors during a performance at the Theatre Royal on 24th March.



National storytelling Week

An example rap about Kindness by Molly:

The children took part in a National Literacy Trust webinar with author Alim Kamara. The children learnt all about using rap (rhythm and poetry) to tell stories and to express themselves. The theme was 'Soundtrack your story' and the children had a go at writing about using their own superpowers for good. The children came up with some great superpowers they have, including being bold, brave, inclusive, powerful, kind, resilient and imaginative. The children used bars of 4 beats to achieve rhythm in their raps. Well done, Chestnut and Sycamore classes!

Mother's Day lunch

It was lovely to be able to welcome so many mums, aunties and grandmas to a mother's day lunch at the school to celebrate and give thanks for the amazing women in our lives.



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I bought a doll for my child recently. I thought it was manufactured by a well-known brand, but I suspect it might be counterfeit. How can I be sure and what are my rights?

You're right to seek advice about this issue, because counterfeit goods aren't only illegal, they can be dangerous.

Fake children's toys in particular, including dolls, often don't meet safety standards and can pose choking hazards - poor manufacturing can mean small parts are easily detachable.

Counterfeit goods are fake products designed to mimic the authentic ones sold by genuine brands. Sometimes it's easy to spot a knock-off, other times it can be harder to tell.

It's not just toys and games - things like clothing, footwear, e-cigarettes, perfumes and media devices can also be counterfeit.

Things to watch out for include strangely low prices from well-known brands and signs of poor quality - like missing security seals, bad or non-existent packaging, blurry logos and poor stitching. You may also spot some spelling mistakes in the advert or on the packaging.

Looking at photos from official sellers can help when making comparisons, and it's important to only buy products from reputable sellers.

If you have purchased a counterfeit item, there are some steps you can take to try and get your money back. You're legally entitled to a full refund on fake goods within 30 days of your purchase. If it's been over 30 days since you paid, but less than six months, the seller can provide you with a real version of the item first. If they can't, then they're legally required to give you a full refund.

If you paid more than six months ago, you're only entitled to a part-refund based on how much you've used the item and how long you've had it.

Sometimes sellers might refuse to refund you, and argue the items were obviously fake because they were very cheap, but they're breaking the law by selling them and your legal rights still apply.

If this happens and you paid by debit card, contact your bank and ask to use the 'chargeback scheme'. If you paid by credit card and the item cost less than £100, you can ask to use the same scheme.

If you paid by credit card and the item cost between £100 and £30,000, tell your credit card company you want to make a 'section 75' claim to get your money back. To report counterfeit goods or get help getting your money back, contact the Citizens Advice Consumer Service. You can also report a seller to Trading Standards, which investigates criminal activity.

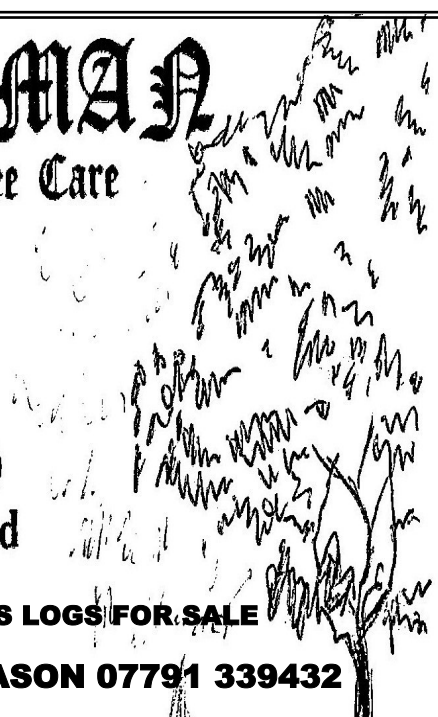
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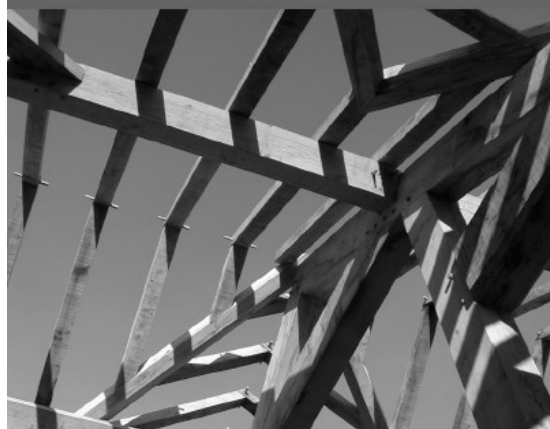

Report of meeting held 9 March 2026

Community Litter Pick – please note the date of the Litter Pick has been changed to Saturday 11 April 2026, meet 9.15am at Wetheringsett Village Hall for a 9.30am start. Volunteers Welcome. Equipment supplied, please bring your own gloves.

Ducks Cross Sign – with the help of Cllr Stuart Wyse a Ducks Crossing sign will be placed along Wetherup Street. The sign has been gifted to Wetherup Street residents. It is hoped this will encourage motorists to slow down to protect the families of ducks and ducklings in the area of the pond.

Solar Speed Sign, Wetherup St/Park Green – parish councillors recorded their thanks to all those residents that responded to the council's request for comments on placing the new solar speed sign. Following consideration the Council agreed to locate it at the east end of Wetherup Street in the vicinity of the current mobile speed camera. The mobile camera will be moved to the Park Green/Station Road location.

Bus Service Improvement Plan – This service would be with the aid of grant funding from Suffolk CC/SuffolkonBoard. The council is required, as a condition of funding, to demonstrate to SuffolkonBoard that a service would be well supported by local residents as well as show continued support at minimal cost once grant funding had been spent. Residents have until 31st March to respond to the Parish Council's request for comments as to whether a bus service through Wetheringsett village would be used. Many thanks to those that have already responded.

Wetheringsett Summer Fete, Saturday 27 June 2026 – Mrs Susannah Howard (Chair of the Fete Committee) attended the meeting to inform the council of preparations for the summer fete. Following the success of last year's summer solstice event, Councillors welcomed the news the fete had been reinstated into the Wetheringsett annual calendar of events. A request for a funding contribution from the Parish Council to the cost of the event was made. Councillors agreed a contribution of £900.

Resignation – sadly resignation from the Council was received from Mrs Lizzie Drury. Many thanks were recorded to Lizzie for her work and contribution to the council over the last number of years, this has been very much appreciated.

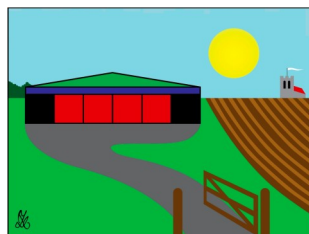

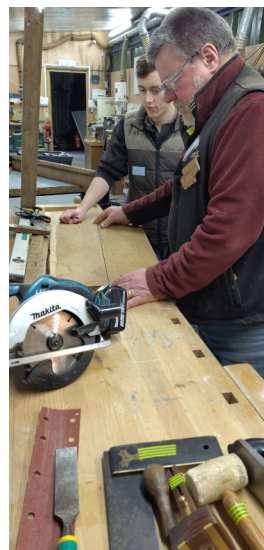
Our provisional dates for Saturday workshops in 2026 are as follows, 10am-2pm:

With the recent spike in heating oil prices, the Wetheringsett Town & Church Trust is offering small grants to help local residents who may be struggling with the cost of heating their homes.

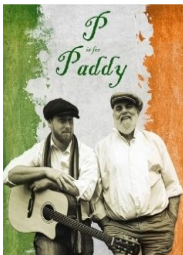
The Trust is a local charity set up specifically to support residents of Wetheringsett-cum-Brockford when financial hardship arises.

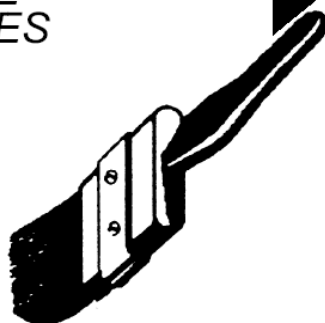

REFRESHMENTS IN THE VILLAGE HALL

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A BUSY PROGRAMME OF ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES AT THE MID-SUFFOLK LIGHT RAILWAY IN 2026

The Mid-Suffolk Light Railway has announced that 2026 will be a very busy year for both arrivals and departures of engines as the railway ensures that there will be a variety of engines in service throughout the running season.

Arriving in time for the Easter reopening of the line will be the R2 class 0-4-0 saddle tank locomotive No. 1370, May .

In June the very first Railbus ever to operate at the Middy will arrive on loan from the East Anglia Railway Museum at Chappel and Wakes Colne station Essex.



John Durrant the Mid-Suffolk railway's Locomotive Manager said: "This is a very important arrival at the railway. Despite the original Middy being a completely steam operated only railway, up to the closure of the line in 1952. This railbus demonstrates what might have been, as it operated on the branch line of the region in the 1960s."

"Our visitors will this June therefore have the opportunity to experience what might have been, as they take a trip to Aspsall Halt aboard E79963 and speculate that this is what the Middy would have been like if it had survived into the 1960s."

The Chairman of the Mid-Suffolk Light Railway Ian Meigh said: "2026 is an extremely important year for the Middy with a number of significant developments.

We always strive to provide a variety of traction for our visitors to enjoy. It is something we are known for and this year we will achieve that with the mix of four different steam engines in service, plus the railbus, a first.

April 2026 Newsletter



In June 2017, twenty-nine Coptic Christians, on a bus travelling to a monastery in Egypt, were murdered by Islamist terrorists. Archbishop Angaelos, Coptic Orthodox Bishop of London, issued a public statement. Two years earlier, following the killing of a group of Ethiopian Christians in Libya, he had called for prayer and forgiveness for the perpetrators. Now he went even further, in words addressed directly to the killers:

"You are loved. You are loved by God as your creator... You are loved by me, and millions like me, not for what you do, but because we believe in transformation..."

It was a remarkable refusal to be drawn into hatred or despair. And, strangely, it came back into my mind as the Epstein scandal unfolded.

The Epstein case was truly awful. The fear and degradation experienced by his victims is unimaginable - inflicted on them by men with great wealth, and an even greater sense of personal entitlement. Universal condemnation is entirely appropriate. Yet there was something about the tone of the public debate that caused me concern. I think it was the sense that some of the public figures who commented were enjoying this opportunity to parade their moral outrage. It can't always be much fun being in public life: your policies or motives constantly held up to suspicion or ridicule by your critics. So how understandable, once in a while, to rejoice in an issue on which you can express strong views, knowing you will receive moral support by all right-thinking people - understandable, but a million miles away from the open-hearted love expressed by Archbishop Angaelos.

It's a million miles, also, from the message of Easter. Easter, to use Archbishop Angaelos's phrase, is the celebration of transformation: a world of grief and loss is transformed into one of joy and hope; a world where might is right, is transformed into one in which the powerless have a say alongside the strong. It is a world in which God's love transforms everything.

I have just (in early March) heard the first in a series of broadcast Lent Talks on BBC Radio 4. This one was given by the head of a charity working with homelessness and deprivation in Wigan. Avoiding making judgements, she said, was vital in her work: it was irrelevant whether her clients were just unlucky, or had brought misfortune on themselves. She concluded:

"Jesus does not save the world by deciding who deserves mercy. He saves it by giving mercy freely... Resurrection does not belong to the deserving; it belongs to the *wounded*."

I think Archbishop Angaelos might agree.

"Alleluia, the Lord is Risen!
He is Risen indeed! Alleluia."

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Wetheringsett Manor School has enjoyed a vibrant and inspiring Spring Term, filled with hands-on learning, exciting opportunities and proud achievements across the whole school community.

Students have taken part in a wide range of careers activities and work experience placements this term, including mechanics, farming, hairdressing, feline care and working with the Dog Squad. Careers trips included a visit to the Norfolk Festival of Knowledge, where pupils explored emerging industries through interactive workshops and talks. In school, we welcomed visitors from the NHS, the RAF Police, the Magistrates Service and a local farmer who brought along a tractor for students to explore.



Students also enjoyed a *Traitors*-inspired World Book Day workshop with Fay Greaves, building confidence in communication and debate.

Our work experience programme continues to grow, with placements in mechanics, farming, hairdressing, feline care and animal handling. The Student Council has also been active, raising £70 through their tuck shop to support a student 10k run for Suffolk Mind, helping push his total to £416 of £450. Another



student is completing a Swimathon for Marie Curie and is already over halfway to his £250 target. Council members also met with the Parish Council to begin planning their involvement in the Wetheringsett Summer Fete.

We are celebrating Tracey Chaplin, who has been invited to Buckingham Palace for her work on the Duke of Edinburgh Award, and Kay, who has now moved on to become Head Teacher at our sister school Abbey Gardens after years of shaping our school community.

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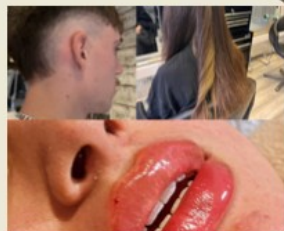
